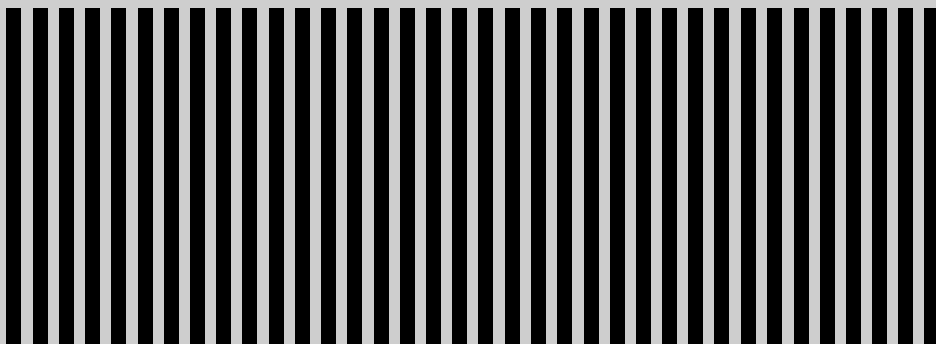

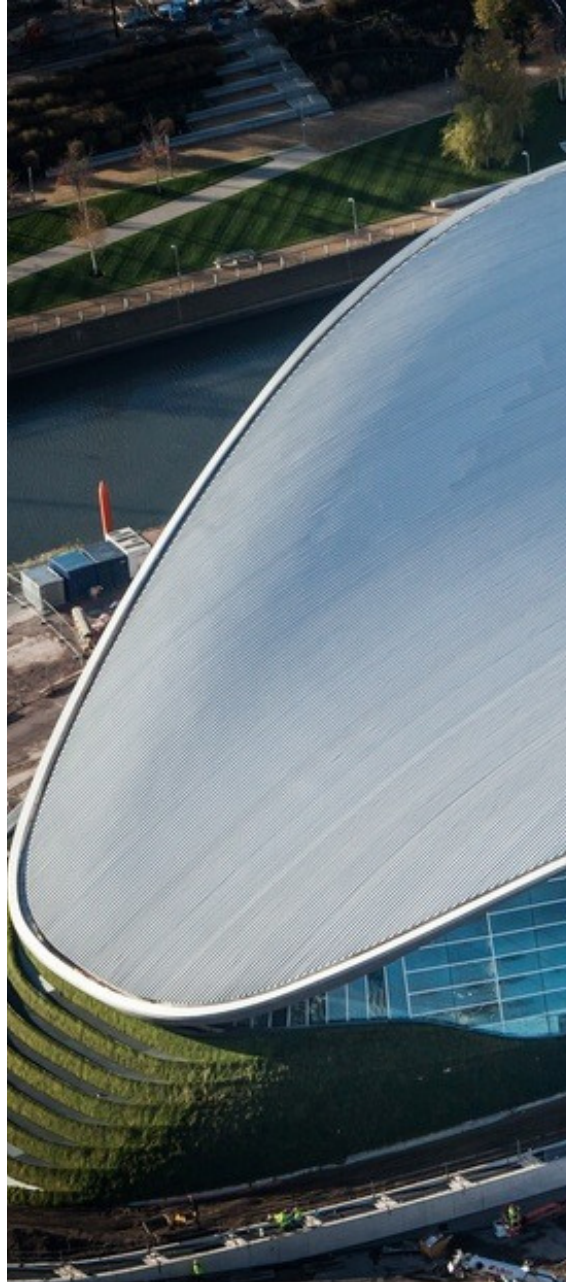
Zaha Hadid Early Life And

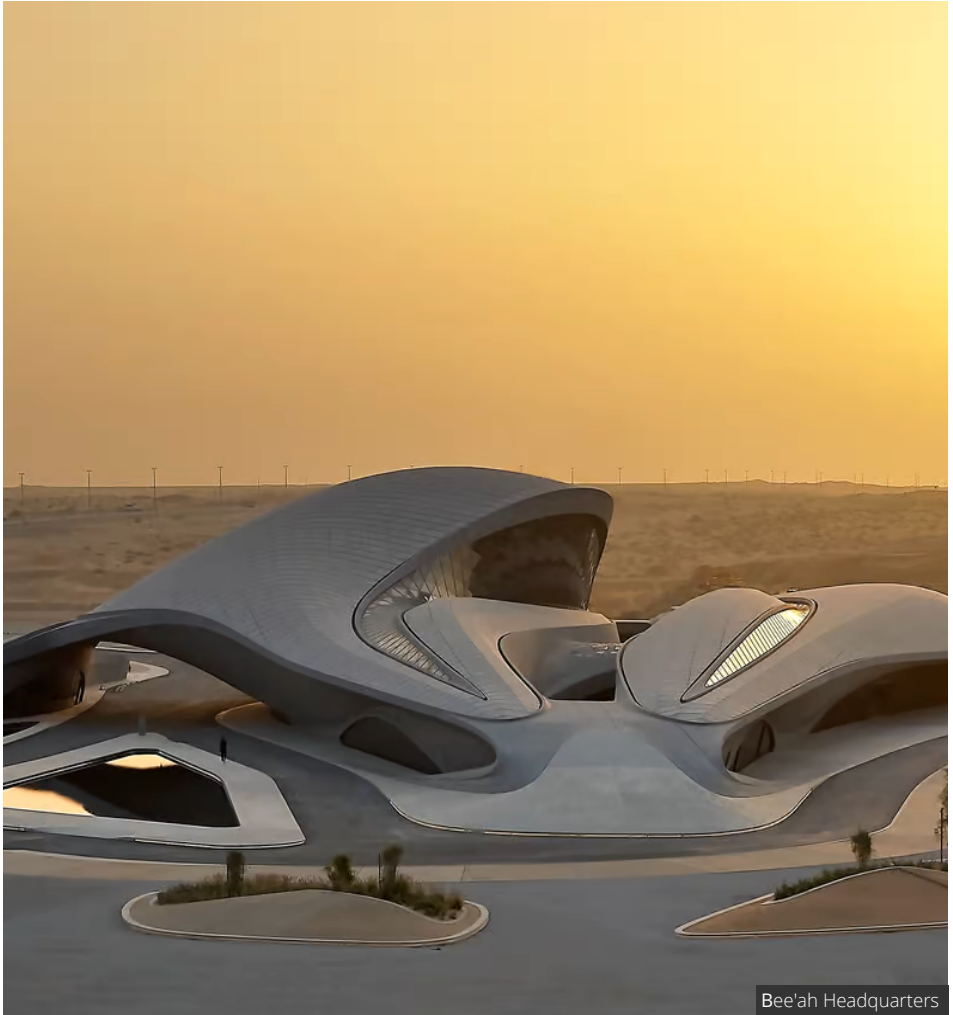
